

Long time Y's Men Pete Wolgast remembers past speakers:

- **Jim Nantz:** When Jim lived in Westport, he spoke to the Y's Men nearly every year. One year as I met him in the parking lot, he apologized for not have time to prepare a presentation. Spoke for five minutes. Then, he took questions for one hour. One of best programs ever. I still remember some of the stories. His dad lived in Houston and Jim expressed disappointment he did not have a club like ours. Asked if we would make his father an honorary member of our club.
- Martha Stewart: She spoke to us in 2002. I knew her from when I was president of the Westport Historical Society. Her people came to our meetings prior to her presentation. No reporters allowed and not recording by us. It was right before Valentines Day. She gave each Y's Man a cookie in the form of a heart and told us to give it to our wives or significant others. Without telling Martha prior to the meeting, I invited her mother, "Big Martha" who was living with her sister in Weston. Martha was thrilled when she learned her mother was present. - Mobil CEO Lou Noto who engineered the merger with Exxon CEO Lee Raymond. I worked with Lee.
- Jet Blue founder and CEO and now founder of Breeze and Azure in Brazil, **David Neeleman**. David and I became friends. He has spoken three times. Featured in a Jeff Benedict book "The Mormon Way of Doing Business." We brought in several other top Mormon business speakers from New Canaan.
- Dave Checketts. Former president of Madison Square Garden and the N.Y. Knicks. Owner of the St. Louis Blues NHL hockey team. I arranged for his to speak when David Neeleman was forced to reschedule a January date with the Y's Men due to a stock offering by Jet Blue. When David's executive assistant Carol Archer called me about the need to reschedule, I asked to speak with David. I told him I would excuse him he would obtain Dave, one of his best Mormon friends in New Canaan, to sub for him. David laughed and then complied with my request.

Let me embellish by adding a Jim Nantz story.

Jim was quite close to George H.W. Bush whom he called "Bush 41". Jim was visiting Bush 41 at the family summer home in Kennebunkport, Maine early in the summer of 2006 after he lost the presidency to Bill Clinton in 1982. Jim and Bush 41 had a golf game scheduled in August and Bush mentioned one of the members of the scheduled foursome would not be able to join them. Jim suggested they invite Tom Brady. Bush responded, "You think he would play with us?" Showing his humble side. Jim responded, "He might".

Jim and Brady were fairly close as well, so the next day he called Tom.
